### **Paul Davis Restoration to complete home restoration for wounded war veteran**

Wilmington, NC – November 11, 2010 – Paul Hunter, [Paul Davis Restoration and Remodeling of the Carolina Coast](#) office owner, announced today that his company is doing its part to help a local war veteran whose home is in need of interior and exterior repairs. As part of the parent company Paul Davis Restoration Inc.'s annual "Paul Davis Restoring America" program, Paul Davis office staff and volunteers will be using their resources of time and materials to make improvements to the home of wounded war veteran United States Marine Corp Lance Corporal David Brown at 512 Saint George Cove in Jacksonville, NC.

According to Hunter, local companies, vendors, suppliers, and tradesmen are being asked to participate in the project and to donate services, labor and materials. The project is slated to begin on Sunday, November 28 with a completion date slated for Sunday, December 5.

Paul Davis Restoring America is a home improvement initiative designed to provide time, labor, and materials to a local beneficiary. Beneficiaries include homeowners who cannot afford or who are physically unable to fix up their homes. Paul Davis Restoration offices throughout the country fix the homes of those in need at no charge, as part of the Restoring America program.

"The Paul Davis office is participating in 'Restoring America,' because we truly believe we can make a difference in the quality of David's life. We'll be assisting the war veteran and his family with improvements to the home which will provide a safe and accessible environment," said Hunter. Hunter and his team of technicians will replace flooring, and install new kitchen cabinets and bi-fold doors for the laundry area, replace the front stoop bricks that have crumbled, install storm door hardware, and fix a shower in the bathroom along with new window treatments and painting throughout the home, among others.

"We identified the Brown family through Captain Charlie Hall with the United States Marine Corp and the Wounded Warrior Regiment. We're pleased to have identified such a worthy recipient," said Hunter.

Lcpl Brown was seriously injured in Iraq and now suffers from traumatic brain injury (TBI) and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Brown also has seizures and is being treated at the traumatic brain injury (TBI) unit at National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, Md.

He was born and raised in Plant City, Fla. and graduated from Plant City High School where he enjoyed playing football for the school team. David Brown's parents still reside in Plant City and they are involved with his recovery from a distance.

Brown is 23 years old his wife Brooke is 22 years old. They have two young children and a new baby. Brooke Brown is staying at the Fisher House in Bethesda at no charge for military families while her husband is in the TIB program. Brooke's parents are taking care of the children in Albemarle, NC.

David is now verbal and can speak clearly. His career ambition is to become a firefighter.

“Our veterans are losing the war in our own country when they come home debilitated and sometimes receive the minimum of military healthcare,” said Brooke Brown. “Too many families are losing the support and closeness of their loved ones in the U.S. when the veterans return with serious maladies due to the consequences of this war,” she said. “We want to make sure that families get the medical and social services they need.”
